TO HEAR THE WORD

SCRIPTURE
MATTHEW 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."'

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' 

THE LORD'S SUPPER

You are invited to come forward via the center aisle to share in Communion. There will be two lines, one on the right and one on the left, leading to communion stations at the front of the sanctuary and at the cross aisle. Please join the line that is closest to you. Communion will be served by "intinction." After you receive a piece of bread from the first person at your station, simply step to the next person holding the cup and dip the bread slightly as it is offered. After you have received communion, you are welcome to go to the chancel rail to kneel and pray or return to your seat via the side aisle. We use grape juice instead of wine so that none may be prohibited from this means of grace. There is a gluten-free station set up near the pulpit. We stand ready to bring communion to anyone with mobility challenges—simply alert an usher. Our communion stewards have each used hand sanitizer and will hand you the bread to avoid spreading germs.
