General Conference 2019: What's So Special?

At the 2016 General Conference, the Bishops suggested that a Special Session of General Conference be held to focus solely on the topic of human sexuality. The first meeting will focus on the propositions put forth to the conference; the second will highlight what has transpired thus far; and the third will recap the conversations and decisions of the conference.
